### **CBT+ Learning Collaborative Training and Consultation**

Open to masters-level mental health providers who treat children and youth ages 4-21. This learning collaborative includes two parts: a 3-day clinical training, followed by twice-monthly, 1-hour group clinical consultation calls for 6 months.

Sessions will run October 14-16, 2019 (Spokane Valley; Centralia), November 4-6 (Yakima), November 18-20 (Bellevue), and January 15-17, 2020 (Bremerton). Training is presented by UW Medicine's Harborview Center for Sexual Assault and Traumatic Stress. Participation fee is \$200.
